

Minimum Criteria from Faculty Handbook for Promotion to Senior Lecturer

3.13.4.3 Upon promotion from lecturer to senior lecturer, faculty members retain their status as faculty members under [Article I of the Faculty Constitution](#). Minimal criteria for consideration of appointment to the rank of senior lecturer are:

- (a) A master's degree from an accredited institution with 18 graduate credits in their field of teaching; and experience teaching a minimum of 40 classes (or the equivalent thereof) at Appalachian post matriculation for the master's degree;
- (b) Demonstrated ability in teaching; and
- (c) Demonstrated ability in institutional service to the university.

Psychology Department Application Process

(Approved by Faculty on 9/25/15)

The candidate should submit a 1-2 page cover letter describing how the candidate meets criteria for promotion to Senior Lecturer as described in the Faculty Handbook. The application should include a current CV and:

- (a) A list of classes taught and when the class was taught;
- (b) Documentation of teaching effectiveness, including a summary of class evaluations and peer reviews;
- (c) Documentation of institutional service; and
- (d) Additional relevant material (e.g., awards).
